RESOURCES FOR NEW CADETS

CADET GREAT START

A 5-week introduction to all aspects of cadet life. Materials include detailed checklists, recipe-like lesson plans, a parents' briefing, training for cadet cadre, and more. It's indoctrination in the best sense of the word.

CADET UNIFORM PROGRAM

Outfits a new cadet with an AF-style blues uniform (sans shoes and insignia), provided AF funds are available.
